



*is like a cup of tea*

*Consent is mandatory  
for every sexual act.

make it even more simple,  
sexual consent can be  
explained like offering  
someone a cup of tea.*

*Suppose you ask...*

**Hey, would you like to

**No thank you. I do  
not want a cup of tea.**

**If they don't want tea, don't make them tea.  
Don't get annoyed that they do not want tea,  
and don't try to pressure them to drink tea.  
Tea is off the table.**



## 10 minutes later...

**Sure, I would  
love a cup of  
tea.**

**On second  
thought, I actually  
do not want tea.**

**They might say "yes please, that is  
kind of you" and when the tea  
arrives they do not want the tea.  
They are under no obligation to  
drink the tea. People change their  
minds and that is okay.**

**Also**

...

**If someone had tea at your house last night, that doesn't mean they want you to make tea all the time. They might never want you to make tea again. That doesn't mean you force them or guilt them into tea again. It was an one time tea.**





**If they are unconscious don't make them tea. Unconscious people don't want tea and can't answer "do you want tea?"**

**Maybe they were conscious when you asked them if they wanted tea, but in the time it took to brew they became unconscious. Put the tea down. Make sure they are safe and don't make them drink the tea.**



**If you can understand tea, you  
can understand consent.**
